## IN TOUCH WITH REDEEMER

*Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.*

*And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” Matthew 28:19-20*



Redeemer Lutheran Church adopted as its mission statement the words that are paraphrased on the wall of our sanctuary “Go Disciple All Nations.” During the time I was asking why this church is here in Willmar most of the congregation responded by telling me that the answer is on the wall. Some may say that we have made a change in our mission statement, that a change was not necessary for us. What change have

we really made? What is different than what we have been doing? Our congregation has now reaffirmed that the words that have been on the wall of the sanctuary, right next to the cross, are the words that will guide us from now on.

There are three verbs in Matthew 28:19 that are significant to us. The first word in the sentence is “Go.” At first glance it is a simple verb and easy to understand, yet in the Greek it is a little more complex. The participle can also be translated as “Continue to Go.” Jesus wanted His followers to continue the journey that He had been taking them on for the previous three years; this command is not something new to them, it is something Christ had been guiding them to do during His ministry here. The same is true for our congregation. We might call this a “new” mission statement but it is something we have always had at the center of who we are as believers.

The next verb in this verse is “To Make Disciples”; it may be easy to say but more difficult to do. Sharing what we believe with others may sound like something that does not appeal to Lutherans; we tend to be more introverted (keep to ourselves) and reserved. To make disciples for Christ means that we invite others on a lifelong journey to live for Christ. This is not an invitation that looks like a fast food model; it looks more like a marathon where runners help and encourage each other to the finish line. At Redeemer we have people of all ages and stages of life. Each one of us has the potential to help and encourage someone else to grow in the knowledge and passion to follow Christ wherever He leads.

The third verb in this verse is a staple in the life of a Lutheran, to see others brought to the waters of Baptism and by the power of the cross walk a different path than the footsteps of the past. Baptism is something that is done by God through the hands of ordinary people. In our sacramental theology Baptism is a cornerstone to the REnewal and REbirth of believers who want to follow in the footsteps of their Lord and King; it is not something that is a marker to how many children are being born to members. At Redeemer there is a reason for the Baptismal font placed at the forefront, it leads to the railings where we partake from His Supper.

The Great Commission has always been important to the life of the church, it is secured to the wall of the sanctuary where we have a visual reminder every week as to why we serve. As we continue to be sent out from the Lord’s Altar may we remember to secure it on our hearts as we seek to grow in our life as disciples of Jesus Christ.

Go 2 Miles!

“Whoever makes you walk a short way, go with him twice as far.” Matthew 5:41 NLV

This past month our confirmation students met with their new mentors, we are currently in our 2nd year of a new system for our mentor program, students receive a mentor when they enter into our confirmation program at the beginning of our 7th grade year. Mentors have the option to stay with their student the full 2 years of confirmation or participate for just one year. Mentors and their mentees meet together on a monthly basis (some meet more than that without prompting from anyone) and share about their lives along with other topics that include; family dynamics, encouraging others, living out our faith in the community, identity in Christ and a few others. These conversations happen in a variety of places; before confirmation over Little Caesars pizza, at a local coffee shop, out in the field working or sometimes even in a fish house out on a frozen lake. We currently have 16 students in our 7th & 8th grade program and 16 mentors that are willing to meet with these youth on a regular basis. I hope that these mentor/mentee relationships are encouraging to them as they grow in their faith. As a leader it is encouraging for me to see the willingness these individuals have, to give of their time and share their faith story with our next generation.

Last month I attended a conference that spoke about the importance of speaking into the lives of our youth and surrounding them with faithful people. One of the books I took away from the conference and read was “Sometimes it Takes a Party,” by Reggie Joiner (a free online ebook if you want to read). In his book Joiner shares 7 concepts about building relationships with people that help lead to opportunities that open the door for us to share our faith. One of these concepts is “Do something you don’t have to do,” based off of Matthew 5:41 “Whoever makes you walk a short way, go with him twice as far.” Joiner focuses on going two miles with someone. In the context that Matthew 5:41 was written it was the practice that Roman soldiers could impose upon people to carry their gear for an entire mile if they were asked. “It was in light of that law that Jesus taught the principle of going an extra mile. [ . . . ] Mile one fulfills the obligation, Mile 2 changed the nature of the relationship (pg 19-20).”

Being a mentor is going the 2 miles. I want to say thank you to those individuals who have volunteered their time to go the extra mile with these youth in their faith walk. May they find joy in this journey as they walk with these students. If you would like to know more about being a mentor please feel free to stop and talk to me in the office we are always looking for individuals to be a part of this program.

Have you ever done something you didn’t have to? What is your 2nd mile moment? Think about going that extra mile with someone, sometimes it is that 2nd mile where the best conversations happen.


