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When I moved to Willmar last year I did not know what to expect and what to hope for. I had a lot of questions about myself and if I could make the transition from an associate pastor to a regular pastor. Over the short time I have been here, I have noticed one thing from where I stand and where I have observed the

congregation. There seems to be a connection happening that has been in the works for some time. I look on with a great smile as people find others in this family with similar backgrounds and stories.

During the Sunday morning announcements, I have often made a point to emphasize two things: sitting closer to the front of the church and attending the Family Education Hour as many times as possible. Giving up your favorite spot has been a little bit of a challenge for some (especially with a "Sheldon" syndrome), but the time between services has been crucial. I once preached that if our attendance does not pick up and the education hour does not increase we will be looking at the closing of this church; and I still believe that to be the case as I am typing these words.

What I have noticed during the Adult Education portion of Sunday morning I am presently surprised when a person or couple will sit down at a table and in a few minutes they appear to be talking with someone they haven't been talking to for years. I am delighted to see people who have been going through similar experiences share a cup of coffee and show genuine caring for others. It is a great feeling to see hope lived out in these lives as we find shared stories the last few months.

Please consider how we operate within our faith family; the importance of meeting together on Sunday morning revolves around our worship of what God has done for us, sharing our stories of where Christ has interacted with us personally, and giving hope to one another that comes from the message of the empty tomb. May we continue to move forward together as we lift up the name of Christ, bear each other's burdens, and care for the community that God has put us in.

### A BORING ISRAELITE

At a previous NYG, I once heard one of the emcees describe herself as a “boring Israelite”. You know the people who followed Moses out of Egypt those “boring Israelites” they didn’t do anything great like part waters, they merely lived their life. Well, I am here today to confess to you that I am a boring Israelite and all of you can be one too.

Who were these boring Israelites? They were ordinary people, fathers, mothers, brothers, sisters, grandparents, young children and yes even teenagers. Moses led them out of Egypt, out of slavery and no not two by two (that’s another story); he led them to freedom, to a better life. Their response in less than one chapter of Exodus they are already complaining to Him. Exodus 14, God’s people are crossing the Red Sea on dry ground, chapter 15 they are singing a song of praise and thanksgiving with Moses and his sister Miriam and by the end of chapter 15 they are grumbling and complaining saying to Moses it would have been better to die in Egypt around pots of meat, but you have led us out into the desert to starve to death. It is this lack of trust and faith that eventually leads them to spend 40 years wandering that desert wasteland eating only manna and quail.

We do not know all their names, but we do know that they continued to live their life. They were there to help their neighbor carry belongings across the red sea. They helped to care for an elderly neighbor or child as they wandered the desert. They were ordinary people. They didn’t part the sea, scout out the Promised Land or lead the battle of Jericho they merely led their life like ordinary people. Yes, there were struggles along the way, like eating only manna for 40 years and seeing the Promised Land but not entering it. God used and continues to use ordinary people to accomplish and share his plan of salvation. Many of our acts of love go relatively unnoticed. But what can happen in our church, in our community when several boring Israelites (ordinary people) start to love our neighbors.

What kind of difference can we make?

So, boring Israelites let us love one another.

I did ask about collecting needed items for the village we will work in but our team leader said that Habitat has pretty strict rules regarding this and it is easier to send donations in to our team's trip which all goes to Habitat. Half of our trip cost is a direct donation to Habitat and if you are a Thrivent member, Thrivent also gives a generous donation on behalf of the workers. Habitat in turn uses these donations to build.

I am excited to share this experience with Molly and who knows if another build is in our future someday.
