

In 2008 Mike Yaconelli wrote in his book Getting Fired For the Glory of God:

Nobody wants to say it, so I'll say it: Most adults in churches don't like kids.

That's why they hire youth workers-to keep the youth out of their hair. They're all in favor of youth Bible studies, youth group meetings, social events, and trips. Adults want youth group to be an activity center, an adolescent baby-sitting service. Parents want youth group to be the perfect alternative, a sanitized enhancement to the other important priorities of their children's lives-like hockey practice, ballet, SAT refresher courses, football camp, and, of course, studying. Youth group is the perfect place for young people when their schedules permit, and when nothing else more important is going on. Youth group is a great place to teach young people how to be good, upstanding citizens and future leaders in the business community-the ideal environment to teach young people how to be compliant, serious, and predictable. It is difficult to believe that this book was written almost ten years ago; the words that this youth worker wrote still stings me to this day. Have you ever read something that as soon as you finished a small section you had to stop and let your brain try to digest what the author was trying to convey? This book by Mike Yaconelli was one of those books; something that I struggled with for some time. Either I did not like what he wrote and wanted to write him an email and challenge his philosophy (he was killed in a car accident so that was out of the question); or I hated what he wrote because he was correct. Do I read only authors that I agree with; or do I read authors that make me think, even though I do not think they have a shred of truth or brainpower?

What is my reaction? I do not like the thought that he could be correct. I like to hear from other adults that my son is very respectful and that he behaves when he is away from me. There are times I am very proud of him in the way that he interacts with others; even when his parents have not given him instructions of our expectations for that circumstance. He has dreams of one day getting a job after he completes college, paying taxes, and paying for his own stuff. I am guessing that most parents in the world would like to see their children do all these things in life; but ultimately is that what I really want to see him as? (continued)

It is my hope that my son will continue to be in God’s Word frequently and seek out the path that God has for him. It might be difficult for me to trust God and what He is doing but I want my son to know that Jesus died for him and that is the single greatest thing to know and understand in this life. I want him to be shaped by God who served us by His sacrificial life; that a life centered on forgiveness day in and day out from the blood of Christ is never a life wasted. I am thankful for the instruction that he has received at home and during Sunday School; in a short time he will reach the age of confirmation and that is where I challenge myself in how we prepare our young people for their eternal future.

Deep down I am not okay with the current state of how we do confirmation and faith formation as Lutherans; some of this is the result of my personality that I want to see things in life run more efficiently, the other part of me knows that I am over the hill and the reality that God has not promised me tomorrow looms. I am not okay with simply having kids memorize Bible verses. I am uneasy if someone cannot tell me who Jesus is to them and what He did for them. On the first Sunday of May I am always uneasy because I do not feel that I have prepared the students enough; the other half of me knows that the students who are confirmed typically leave the church doors that day and rarely enter again. My reaction is that this is not okay with me! The thought of investing two years with a young person and then not seeing them again does not sit well with me, I know that some of the most difficult times in a person’s life occur while someone is young; I would hope that a church living by the new birth in the blood of The Lamb would be a place eager to provide, protect, and mentor our young men and women. As of right now we are losing 70-80% of our young people less than two years after they are confirmed, what will our reaction going forward be?

It is not okay with me; eternal life is permanent! As a church we will need each other. Parents, you may feel like you cannot raise your kids up in the faith without reinforcements. Pastors cannot transform kids into model citizens. As a member of the body of Christ we are held together by Him, we will all need each other as we go forward in faith.

On a desolate hill somewhere off the shores of the Sea of Galilee, a young boy sat down to listen to the teacher. The great teacher whom he had heard so much about; for hours he sat and listened until his stomach and the stomachs of those sitting around him started to rumble with hunger. They were in the middle of nowhere, no Taco Bell, no Jimmy Johns delivery but only two fish and five small loaves was all the boy had. One of the teacher's disciples wandered through the seated crowd desperately asking anyone in the crowd if they had food to share. The only thing in sight for food for miles was the lunch basket the boy had been given to take along. Handing his lunch over to them knowing it wouldn't make that much difference in such a large crowd, the boy watched as the disciple passed on the meal to the teacher who said a blessing over it and broke the loaves of bread and had his disciples distribute.

We all know the rest of this story the 2 fish and 5 small loaves went onto feed very well more than 5,000 men, women and children that day with enough leftovers to fill 12 baskets. We all know the miracle but if we look at it from the perspective of the little boy he didn't have much to offer. With a willing heart he gave his best to the meal that day and Jesus used his best to do the impossible.

"Bring what you have, even it feels like it's as small as five loaves and two fish. Sometimes God multiplies our small gifts miraculously." Author and speaker Bob Lenz shares this in his new book written with Rich Melheim <18> Faith For The Next Generation. This is such a great reminder for all of us to hear, it doesn't take great amounts of spiritual knowledge, great strength or lots of skills we just have to be willing to give God our best and let him perform the miracles.

I say this because there are a lot of opportunities to bring God your best at Redeemer. As we prepare to wind down our school year we are already planning for our summer ministry season full of things like VBS, Parades, Summer Family Camping Weekends, Picnics, and Mission Trips. Oh and the regular weekly worship throughout the summer too. It seems like all of us are just as or even more busy during the Summer season. Is there some way you can help during this time? 

In Christ Alone

At Redeemer, most of us have grown up singing hymns from various hymnals. We know these hymns very well, and the familiarity of them give us encouragement and strength. There is something quite profound about singing a great hymn of faith with other believers. In recent years, there have been new hymns written. These more contemporary hymns have the same inherent truths that the older familiar hymns contain, but are sometimes presented differently in the way they are accompanied. One of these new hymns, In Christ Alone, has been used in churches around the world. The melody is one you may find yourself humming throughout the day. The lyrics are strong, but how strong? When I choose songs for worship, I often spend time with the lyrics and in God's word. It is so important that what we sing speaks truth and aligns itself with the Bible. This verse from 1 Corinthians 14:15 is a verse that I read and take to heart when choosing music.

"So what shall I do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will also pray with my understanding; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my understanding."

Understanding how scripture is used in the words of a song creates a deeper meaning when we sing it as a body of Christ. The song, In Christ Alone, is one that I have recently spent some time with. It didn't take too long to find just how biblically solid this song is!

"In Christ alone, my hope is found" Psalm 33:20-22 "We wait in hope for the LORD; he is our help and our shield. In him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in his holy name. May your unfailing love be with us, LORD, even as we put our hope in you."

"He is my light, my strength, my song" Isaiah 12:2 "Surely God is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid. The Lord, the Lord, is my strength and my song; He has become my salvation."

"This cornerstone, this solid ground" Ephesians 2:19-22 "Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit."

"Firm through the fiercest drought and storm" Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

"What heights of love, what depths of peace" Romans 8:38-39 "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

"When fears are stilled, when strivings cease" Philippians 4:6-7 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

"My comforter, my all in all" Colossians 1:15-20 "The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross."

"Here in the love of Christ I stand" Galatians 2:20 "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."


